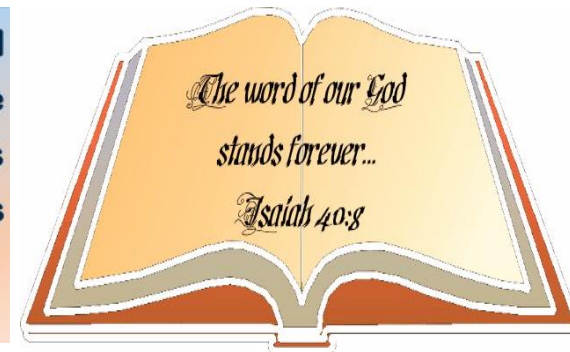

Juneteenth, celebrated on June 19, commemorates the end of slavery in the United States and will be observed as a federal holiday in 2026.

Historical Background

Juneteenth, officially known as **Juneteenth National Independence Day**, marks the day in 1865 when Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas, and announced the end of the Civil War and the emancipation of enslaved people in the state. This announcement came two and a half years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the **Emancipation Proclamation** on January 1, 1863, which declared that all enslaved people in Confederate states were to be set free. However, enforcement of this proclamation was slow, and many enslaved individuals remained in bondage until Union troops arrived in Texas.

Significance of Juneteenth

Juneteenth symbolizes African American freedom and has evolved into a celebration of African American culture and heritage. The holiday was first celebrated in 1866 and has grown in recognition over the years. It became a federal holiday on June 17, 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the **Juneteenth National Independence Day Act** into law, making it the first new federal holiday since Martin Luther King Jr. Day was established in 1983.
